## What's going on in: Parkdale



We love Parkdale because we welcome all different religions and races to the school. We love the range of clubs on offer right across the school, which encourages our social skills, team work, fitness and entertainment. We have lots of clubs in our school – before school, at lunchtime and after school.

#### Rewards

In our school we are rewarded with many different awards for many different reasons and we would like to tell you about some. Every month we have a Star Writer; this is a child who has exceeded in their neatness and quality of their writing. They are then rewarded with a small trophy and their super work is put on display outside the Head's office, for all to see and read. Our school has 4 houses, these are: Newstead, Clumber, Rufford and Wollaton. Whenever a pupil does something kind, or have exceedingly improved in their work, they will get a house point. Each term, the house with the most house points gets a non-school uniform day. At the end of the year the house with the overall most points gets a trip to the cinema in school time. Every week, one child from each class is chosen for reasons picked by their teacher, they are then rewarded with a certificate which contains their name and what they have done really well that week, they are the Star of the Week. Also in our assembly we have the Kindness box which is a box is full of smiley faces. The smiley faces are only given to the children who have been kind to one-another, the box is then shaken and the Teacher doing the assembly picks out a face and the kindness winner is chosen.

#### Mindfulness

We encourage all children to be mindful and we have many apps we are allowed to go on to calm ourselves down; one of these is called Go Noodle. One of our methods is breathing, not normally, but slowly in, slowly out.
