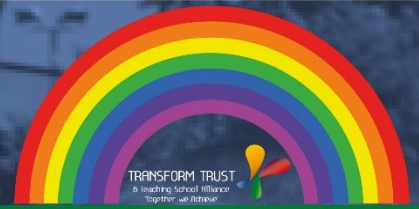


LOCKDOWN LEGENDS

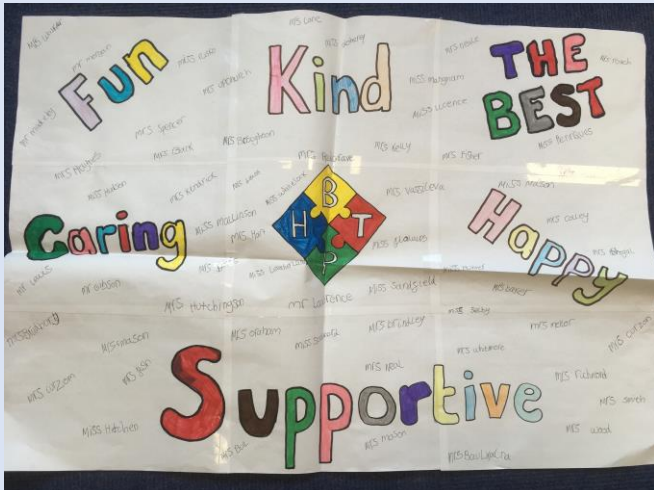


Everyone did a great job and we hope they and their families enjoyed eating their delicious products too.

A pupil from **Rosslyn** was spotted on the Inspire Gymnastics Club Facebook page raising money for the club.



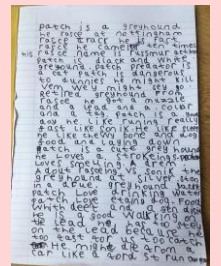
Thank you so much to Jessica for her awesome fundraising effort for Team Inspire! 7 crazy challenges in 7 days raised £515.73!
