I am a SENDCo at Edale Rise and I am very lucky to have a brilliant, supportive team of expertise around me who always go above and beyond. I would like to draw your attention to how a member of our team is, in these challenging times, going above and beyond to continue to support one of our children during closure.

A Teaching Assistant and keyworker to one of our children with complex special needs, has been maintaining contact and providing curriculum support by making personalised videos to send to the family. These videos cover a range of needs from the tailored curriculum delivered in schoolcommunication & interaction, play, toileting, movement, wellbeing – and mum reports how these are looked forward to with anticipation (huge step of progress for this child) and excitement and how engaging they are. I am sure you will agree how important this continued 'face-to-face' contact will have been to support transition when we do eventually return to school.

She always does make the most of any CPD opportunities but, during closure, has continued this to enhance the support she is providing.

This has all been done through her own initiative, dedication and professionalism so I hope you agree that she really has gone 'above and beyond' at this difficult time. She is a real asset to our wonderful SEND team.

I hope you don't mind me emailing you. However, I have a message for the Trust staff that I hoped you could pass on for me (anonymously if you wouldn't mind).

I would like it to be known to all Trust staff members just how supported and empowered I feel to guide the school through these challenging times with the Transform team behind me. The Heads meeting yesterday was exceptional and has had a huge impact on my action planning moving forward. Every question was discussed and answered, no matter how big or small. I have been reading lots of books. My favourite is Evie in the Jungle because it has animals in.






I have been doing lots of creative things which makes me happy. I made my neighbour A rainbow because they are sad and have been poorly. I miss you lots From Neve
