We are a World Class Multi-Academy Trust (MAT)

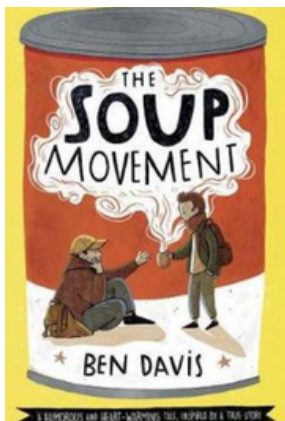
